Spellings

Please ask your child what their spelling score was and help them to learn spellings for their weekly spelling test.

Class 1

The infants this week have been learning about more animals and their habitats. Ask your child about eels and the Sargossa Sea. Also, we now know lots of baby animals and their names. Please research with your child to find out what a young hedgehog is called.

In maths we have been exploring 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. Ask your child about shapes they see at home e.g. cereal boxes, how many edges, faces and vertices (corners)?

In science we have been doing a couple of really interesting colour mixing experiments with milk, washing up liquid, food colouring and flowers.

Class 2

Class 2 have been learning all about Arctic Fox and eels, in particular about their appearance, stages of life and habitats. In maths, chocolate has been divided to study equivalent fractions.

Class 3

Class 3 have been busy with British science week. They have all used their knowledge and reasoning skills to solve some of the “Explorify” thinking problems too.

On Wednesday, along with Class 2, they investigated bread making. The children asked if we could include the recipe for them to try at home as they all agreed the bread buns were easy to make and very delicious.
