Class 2: Leyton for consistantly good work and a great attitude toward learning.


Class 3: Frankie for being inclusive and encouraging in group activities.

Class 1: Time is going so quickly! Our caterpillars have begun their next phase of their metamorphosis as they are now a chrysalis. The children are very excited and have been able to witness them changing. In phonics we have begun with the split digraphs and practising words that use them. They should be able to tell you that the magic “e” gives the vowel the long sound. In maths we have been finding two more and using number lines, money and people to achieve this. We have also been counting on in ones from a given number. Say a number i.e. 14 and ask your child to count on from this to 20 or so.

Class 2: In class 2 this week we have been learning about the author Allan Arlberg. Linking with our money work class 2 have been taking part in activities related to master money the millionaire. We have also studied Miss Brick the builder’s baby. In science we have developed this story by investigating material and their properties.

Class 3: This week class 3 have been super busy. We have applied a variety of maths, science and engineering skills as we followed instructions to make out shaduf. The children used problem solving skills to adjust their designs in both their shoduf and earthquake towers. All of the children did a brilliant job starting their Lego coding journey. In maths we have practiced converting fractions to decimals using their place value skills. The children have explored the Ancient Egyptian writing system of hieroglyphics and using their papyrus created super art work. Well done class 3!



Class 4: This week all of Class 4 scored 10 out of 10 in their weekly spellings, which is a fabulous result. We have almost completed the research work and begun putting together our class museum, which we visited to complete our question trails. Following on from our learning in Science about light and The Egyptians in history and Geography we have created a sundial on our yard by charting the rotation of the earth which changed the position of the shadow from our ruler helping us to record the time. We also drew around Lola’s shadow and predicted and then observed how it would change in shape and direction over the day. This science work led to a huge maths session as the children had lots of questions about the changes in size and angles of Lola’s shadow compared to Lola’s actual height and position on the playground. Predicting Observing, discussing and making further predictions Macie was measuring the angle of turn between the hour marks. Sonny, Seb and Macie could explain why the angle was consistently 15’ This morning we were give a present, a beautiful book that was provided free to school by Jamie Norrington of the Cumbria Wildlife Trust, it is called The Lost Words by Robert Macfarlane and Jackie Morris and already we are enjoying it and everyone else cannot wait for their turn to read it and look at and talk about the beautiful Cumbrian wildlife illustrations too.

What to bring with you...

Lowca Primary Juniors – 1 night residential

Once you have arrived at Bassenfell there will be a short welcome talk and then you will be going straight out canoeing. You won't be going to your bedrooms or unpacking your luggage until later in the day, so it's important that you follow the instructions below so that you have what you need for the day. Please make sure all items are labelled with your name.

What to wear on the day of your arrival:

Please come dressed ready for canoeing in warm, comfy clothes that you don't mind getting wet :

- Warm tracksuit bottoms (not jeans)
- T-shirt/thermal
- Warm jumper / fleece
- Trainers (that you don't mind getting wet)

- Spare t-shirt, jumper, trousers, underwear and trainers (to change into when the other ones get wet)
- Towel

- Sun cream and sun hat (if warm and sunny!)
- Any medication needed

Put a large sticky label on this bag with your name on.

Pack these items in a separate bag/suitcase which will be stored until teatime:

- Slippers/indoor shoes
- Extra set of clothes, underwear and socks
- Sleeping bag and pillow case
- Pyjamas
- Bin bag for dirty clothes
- Toiletries – soap, toothbrush, toothpaste
- Torch
- Clock or watch
