### **Next academic year’s classes.**

In September we are glad to welcome back Mrs. Ditchfield who is fully recovered from her illness. Mrs Ditchfield will be class teacher for the reception (new starters) and the year 1 (currently reception) children in classroom number 1. In classroom no.2, Mrs. Crawford will be class teacher for years 2 and 3 (those who are currently in year 1 or year 2). The year groups 4, 5 and 6 will be taught by Mrs Lawson in classroom 3. Our pupils will also be supported by Mrs. Draper, Miss O’Neil, Miss Rawlinson (student with Lakes College), Mrs. Oakes, Mrs. Cartner and our level 3 apprentices Miss Gilmour and Miss Smith. Miss Henderson will be returning to school in February 2020 following her maternity leave. This gives the pupils excellent adult to pupil ratios of 1:7 or less, which will help to stretch or support the children.

**Uniform Order** Our school uniform is very smart and consists of: a navy sweatshirt with embroidered logo; white polo shirt (plain or with school logo); navy, black or dark grey trousers; navy, black or dark grey skirts; navy, black or dark grey shorts (for summer.) School uniform is ordered online from Identity, which can be delivered to school free of charge or delivered to your home. The log-on details are:

- In your search engine enter [www.oneidentity.co.uk](http://www.oneidentity.co.uk) Look for the one that says ‘Identity-largest school wear stockiest in Cumbria’ (just to make sure)
- Click on this. It will come up with the schoolwear page. Click on ‘shop now’.
- It will ask you to click on the alphabet row at the top – click ‘L’, which will bring up all the schools whose name begins with L. Select Lowca. It will bring up a split screen, P.E. kit or Uniform. Click as required.
- You will be asked to register on the site. You will be sent an authorization email within 48 hours, once you have responded to that you will be able to place your order. **You need to register first before you can place your order.** The Lowca password it will ask you for is *Lowca101!* .

**Lunch cost increase** We have had increased costs for lunches over the last few years which the school has absorbed. However, regrettably, the cost for school lunches will increase in September 2019 up to £2.20 per day as we are unable to absorb the recent increase in costs within the school budget. This still represents fantastic value for money.
