**CLASS 1** We have started our new 'Growing' topic this week and have been having great fun measuring our own heights, it will be interesting to see if any of us will have grown between now and the Easter break! We have labelled parts of a flower in our lessons this week, and we are also setting up some investigations with Hyacinth bulbs, to see how they respond to various changes around them. We have also been doing some measuring work using rulers and learning how to draw straight lines with them. Please could we remind parents and carers to send their children with plenty of warm clothing on on Thursdays for outdoor learning whilst we are going through this cold spell? Thank you.

**CLASS 2** In Year 2 one of the things we have been thinking about is identifying parts of sentences. In the style of Nick Sharratt's Cheese and Tomato Spider, the children mixed up sentences and then put them back



together with an opener, an adjective, a noun and a verb phrase. We read out from our class book and the children particularly laughed at the deep sea diving ice-cream that swam with mermaids. In



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maths we have been measuring liquids and weight while we made pancakes and then we were learning about fractions of pancakes.

## CLASS 3

The juniors have started their new topic on 'Developing Countries', with the initial focus on the Solomon Islands. They have been discussing the criteria on what makes a country 'developing' or already 'developed'.

Everyone has been busy with their maths skills-Y3 and Y4 have been working on Data Collection and have learned how to plot both bar and line graphs and how to read the data from the tables and picto-grams. Y5 have been working on all aspects of fractions and Y6 are continuing to consolidate the last 4 years' worth of work in preparation of their SATS examinations in May.
