Class 1: This week we have been very busy outside in the garden each day. The highlight for the children was painting the path. We had great fun mixing the paint and finding out which colours we could make. Ask your child what happens when we mix blue with red or red with yellow. In phonics, all the phase 2 letters have been introduced and the tricky words for reading and spelling. Over the week could you please keep up with their phonics-they will have their last letters, spellings and sentences in their orange envelopes. Have a lovely break, when we return our new topic is space.

Class 2: This week we have been learning about religions of the world and focusing on Judaism. We have been using Dienes hundreds, tens and units while calculating big calculations. Thank you to Erin Quin for raising £600 for our school funds by climbing all the way to the top of Skiddaw. We are going to buy some large wooden construction for our playtimes.



Class 3: This week class 3 have been carrying out a range of activities. We have set up a scientific enquiry exploring how different liquids effect our teeth. We used boiled eggs and made observations every day to keep in with fair testing. Every day the children have explored different types of poems and have created their own spooky haikus limericks and kennings. The children have worked well to complete a scavenger hunt and have been creative all week. Well done class 3 for a super half term! Hope everyone has a good break and looking forward to a new term of learning, exploring and creating.

Class 4: This week in Class 4 we have painted our healthy food clay models and they look fantastic. In English we have written our own chiller stories and made them into books. Then, on Friday afternoon we dimmed the lights and held a story-telling session to share our books (with a fortifying hot chocolate, Halloween lolly and chocolate eyeball each just in case the stories were too gruesome).The year 6 have been working on BIDMAS, problem solving and fractions in maths and year 5 have just finished their unit of work on addition and subtraction.
