Class 1: Saul for trying really hard in his phonics, not giving up and learning lots of new stuff to him help become a great reader and writer one day.

Class 1: Reception have particularly been enjoying role play together. They do a great job of thinking up dramatic storylines and responding to each other's play ideas. Have a look on our wall display of photos and captions to see more.

On Thursday we set up a huge tray of water with things in to see if it would turn to ice overnight when it was cold. We were very excited the next morning to find a thin layer of ice that we could pick up and drop on the floor so it could smash into tiny pieces.

This week we have been very busy in class 1. Year one children have been correcting mixed up sentences and adding correct punctuation. The trick is to make your child read what they have written. Often they will say what they think they've written, if they misread their writing, gently correct them. In maths we have compared math statements with addition, subtraction and used the inequality signs of greater than, less than or equal to. The 'Christmas season' has arrived! The infants have been singing their nativity songs and year 2 have been practising their scripts, thank you for supporting them, the first run through with lines was great.

Class 2: This week we have been looking at using inverse operations when calculating. **Question-Pete measured his hair and it was 15mmlong.Pete's hair had grown 5mms.How long was it last time?** Jack summed it up, "To work it out you have got to unadd it and that's a take away." We have also learned about why the sea is salty and about marsupials and anvils as well as lots of other child led enquiries. In English we have been learning about power stations and William Caxton.

Class 3: The juniors have been busy again this week with our science topic work. Next week in English we will be debating whether teachers should be replaced by robots, please can you help your child to discuss the pros and cons of this idea. Year 6 have put up the Christmas tree and it look beautiful.
