**Class 1** In English we have worked on reading and spelling words with 'th', 'qu' and 'ch' and reading and spelling the Reception and Year One Tricky (can't be sounded out) words. Whilst enjoying the Stick Man story, we have thought and written about what happened when Stick Man returned home. Working in small groups and sharing our ideas with the class, helped us practice our team work and speaking and listening too. In Maths, Y1 have learned about how arrays have rows and columns and if you add up all the rows or columns, you have the total. Reception used their adding skills as they played Snakes and Ladders with 2 dice for each team. Outdoors we have practiced for Sports Day, with javelin throwing proving most exciting and skipping with the relay race being quite tricky to get the hang of.
